

## University of Delaware Advanced Placement Credit

The first four columns of the following table show how AP exam scores translate into courses for students who entered the University of Delaware during the 2015-2016 school year. The last column shows the Elementary Teacher Education (ETE) General Studies or concentration requirements that the courses would satisfy beginning Fall 2015. All courses in the table would satisfy the elective courses required in the special education concentration, including the courses with blank cells in the last column.
