Pedagogies of Promise in Community-Engaged Teacher Preparation



This colloquium will examine the nine-year history of Ball State University's nationally-recognized Schools Within the Context of Community project, specifically focusing on community-engaged pedagogies used in the development of culturally-sustaining, equity-focused, socially just future teachers, and their impact on candidates, the community, schools, and P-5 student learning. Audience members will be encouraged to consider how this model of community-engaged teacher preparation has relevance for their individual institutions and the community contexts in which they are situated.

Eva Zygmunt is the Helen Gant Elmore Distinguished Professor of Elementary Education and director of the Schools Within the Context of Community program of teacher preparation at Ball State University.

Patricia Clark is professor of Early Childhood Education, chair of the Department of Elementary Education, and co-founder of the Schools Within the Context of Community community-engaged program of teacher preparation at Ball State University.
