

Elementary Special Education 4+1 Program for ETE Students

The recommended schedule illustrates when Elementary Teacher Education (ETE) students could complete the 33 graduate credits for the 4+1 track in elementary special education within the M.Ed. in Exceptional Children and Youth. This plan is only available for UD Elementary Teacher Education majors in the middle school; race, culture, and equity education; or ESL concentrations. Students cannot take more than 9 graduate credits prior to matriculating in the graduate program. Please note that the days on which courses are scheduled may change. If you anticipate not following the recommended schedule please contact your undergraduate advisor, graduate advisor and 4+1 coordinator.
